
FIND IT: The London spot is yet to be confirmed, but we predict it could be in Soho.

VINTAGE BOOKS

Forget wine, vintage books are the order of the day at Toronto bookstore/antiquarian specialist Monkey's Paw. Its Biblio-Mat vending machine is stocked with rare reads – carefully picked by the store's owner Stephen Fowler and guaranteed to be *at least* 25 years old – and are popped out randomly.


Manicures: Because who needs a chipped nail on a night out? This machine would repaint nails to the exact colour and dry them in just 60 seconds.



THE INSIDER GUIDE

With its sweeping beaches, lush mountain landscape and picturesque villages, there's more than one reason why this Balearic island rocks



ITH ITS LIVELY
beaches and neon-lit
strip, the western resort of
Magaluf has been pulling in
the tourist trade to Majorca since package
holidays kicked off in the 1970s. But venture
a little further and you'll find that the largest
Balearic island has more to offer than just
sun, sea and sand.

If ving been conquered by the Roma ns and Arabs before being returned to Spain, the island of Majorca enjoys diverse architecture, which can be seen as the countryside unfolds to the capital Palma's west through Calvi, revealing pockets of small Arabic-influenced towns and ancient watchtowers on high cliff-faces overlooking wild calas (coves).

Ruling this landscape are the rugged Serra de Tramuntana mountains, which were given UNESCO's seal of approval in 2011. It was on top of these mountains – Puig de sa Morisca, to be precise – where James I the Conqueror fought to reclaim Majorca from Moorish rule in 1229 and where the country's highest peak, Puig Major, provided the setting for the much-hyped sci-fi drama *Cloud Atlas* starring Tom Hanks and Halle Berry.

Id ading north, you start to understand why everyone from Grace Kelly to Michael Douglas and Catherine Zeta-Jones have fallen under Majorca's magical spell: the beautiful northern villages of Valdemossa, S lle r and Dei – the latter reminiscent of Italy's Amalfi Coast – feel a world away from the high-rise resorts.

But the island doesn't discriminate. Even without an A-list budget, you can still enjoy the best of Majorca without denting your bank account. Base yourself in the south of the island, with its wide, open beaches, and you can easily make day trips to discover the island's gems.





MUST-SEE

Start off by exploring Palma's narrow cobbled streets, quaint squares dotted with tapas bars and its colossal 17 h-century Le Seu cathedral, an icon that sits on the site of a former Roma n citadel and Arabic mosque. From the station next to the city's Plaza de E pa a, you can take the 100 year-old wooden train to the picturesque seaside town of S lle r in the northwest, which runs through 13 tunnels in the Tramuntana mountains (£105 0 one-way, £16.50 return). The journey takes an hour and is a popular tourist route, but it's undoubtedly the best way to see Majorca's inland beauty. Don't leave before picking up some homemade ice cream from Sa F brica de Gelats (13 Avinguda de Crist fol Colom). Make sure you also save a day to experience traditional life in one of Majorca's inland villages, like Mancor de la Va ll (not to be confused with Manacor, birthplace of local tennis champ A fael Nadal). Situated at the foothills of Tramuntana, the markets are best experienced at the weekend, when stalls of local cuisine lace the streets and folk music and dancing enlivens the main square. In between performances, sample and pick up sobrassada sausages, buu elos (a potatobased fried dough ball) and Majorcan herbes or palo - strong, slightly sweet herb and root-based liqueurs that are consumed as an aperitif - from one of the stalls.

"I'd say the best beach on the island is Sa Calobra, just north of Sóller. You can only get there by car via a curvy road - though you mustn't be afraid of heights as it goes down the mountains."

WHERE TO STAY

The luxurious Sentido Punta del Mar (thomascook.com) is an adults-only hideaway located on a rocky headland in Santa Ponsa in the southwest, and is renowned for its gorgeous ocean views. The newly renovated resort is an oasis of calm with two outdoor swimming pools, floor-to-ceiling windows and direct access to the sea. Those looking for a more affordable option should check into Let el Marina Torrenova (thomascook.com). With a wealth of Kids' Club facilities (see pages 606 1 for more information), including a splash pool and a playground, all-inclusive dining and its snug location between Palma Nova Beach and powder-white Magaluf Beach, it's perfect for families.

LOCAL DINING

If you're after real-deal Majorcan food with Michelin stars, try Trist n Bistro (Local 1, Rt erto R rtals, +34 9176 755 4 7) in Calvi 's Portals Nous neighbourhood. A firm favourite with the jet set for nearly 25 years, dishes such as crispy fried breast of poulard (young hen) with spinach, potato and a lemon sauce (£1775) are served on Ve rsace tableware. A few doors down, Flanigan (Local 16, Ru erto Po rtals, +34 97 679 191) is a hot table without the fuss and an apple tart dessert that requires a 30mi nute advance order due to its elaborateness (but it's worth the wait). King Juan Carlos of Spain - who regularly docks his royal fleet of yachts at the port near the restaurant is reported to be a fan of the paella. For a more casual affair, Bar Nou (7C alle Mayor, +3497 28 3170) serves generous plates of home-cooked tumbet (potato, pepper and aubergine stew) and arr s brut, a rice soup prepared in a clay pot, for about £85 010 But if it's a unique Majorcan experience you're after, search out a celler. Ho used in old cellars, expect dining rooms kitted out in thrifty d cor (think old wine barrels and vintage bull-fighting posters), often running specials. Palma's Celler Sa Premsa (81) aza Obispo Berenguer de Pal ou, +34 97 723 529) does a daily lunchtime three-course deal for £1075 (£116 0 on Saturdays).

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THE GREAT OUTDOORS

With its warmer climate and challenging mountain paths, Majorca draws a dedicated crowd of sporting personalities, including Team GB, who trained here for the London 202 Olympics. Both seasoned and casual cyclists and hikers can follow one of 11 well-marked routes that visitcalvia.com hosts, including the 23km-long GR 21 in the southwest, which runs from E Capdell to E tellencs, dipping into the Galatz Va lley for an imposing view of the mountainous surroundings. But even more visually spectacular is the Tramuntana route at sunset, which passes the Arabicstyle villages of E porles and Banyalbufar, a 17 h-century toll booth-turned-gateway for tobacco and cigarette smuggling, and the 16 th-century defence tower of Torre des Verger. Meaning 'Tower of Souls', this romantic spot is perched high on a cliff and delivers an awe-inspiring panorama of the coastline and the iconic Sa Foradada rock close to Dei . Cycling stations are dotted all over the island, including one owned by professional cyclist and Tour de France champ Stephen Rich e (stephenroche.com) where you can join a tour to visit the scenic off-road sites around the island.

BEACHES

With an average summer temperature of 27°c, you'll want to pen in some beach time. The dramatic western shoreline is dominated by craggy cliffs and stoney coves, so head to the south for wide, inviting and sandy shores that stretch one after the other so smoothly, that you can pretty much walk the coastline for hours uncovering sand, surf and calas. Paguera's Palmira beach connects to Playa de Tor and Playa de la Romana, with Cala Fornells not far beyond reach by foot either. Its palm-fringed white sands lie right behind the main street, with its wealth of cool caf s and bars and water sports outlets, but you can explore the edges to find hidden nooks away from the crowds. Look out for special summer entertainment, like movie screenings on the beach.

LOCAL'S TIP

"Ruta Martiana, which literally translates to 'Mars Route', is an initiative by some bars in downtown Palma to draw in guests on Tuesdays. For €2 (£1.70), you get a small glass of beer or wine and one portion of tapas. It's a great way to have a cheap night out in Palma in a part of town where the locals hang out."

AFTER DARK

Magaluf has been drawing clubbing enthusiasts, high-profile DJs (think David Guetta and Ti sto) and big-name acts like Jessie J and Professor Green to its infamous strip for years. But a more sophisticated nightlife trend is 'Gin and Tonica', which, as you might guess, pays homage to the humble G&F. Seen more as an art form, bars here pair the refreshing drink with citrus fruits before pouring generously into high tumblers. Santa Ponsa's Bar Charlotte (96 Avenida Ry 7 aime I) is a little hole-in-thewall that doesn't close until you're done, with drinks from £9.60 but those wishing to up the ante will love Palma's Ginbo (14A Paseo ${\it Mallorca}$). ${\bf k}$ en more impressive than its 100s trong selection of gins and eight tonics is the signature 'perfume' that's distilled onsite and mixed into each concoction.
